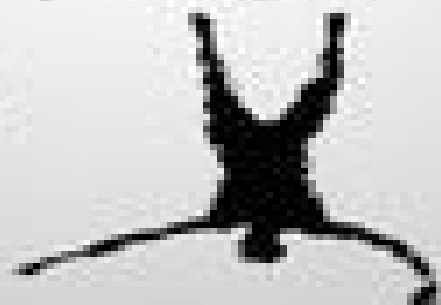





The Foolishness of the cross (1:18-25)

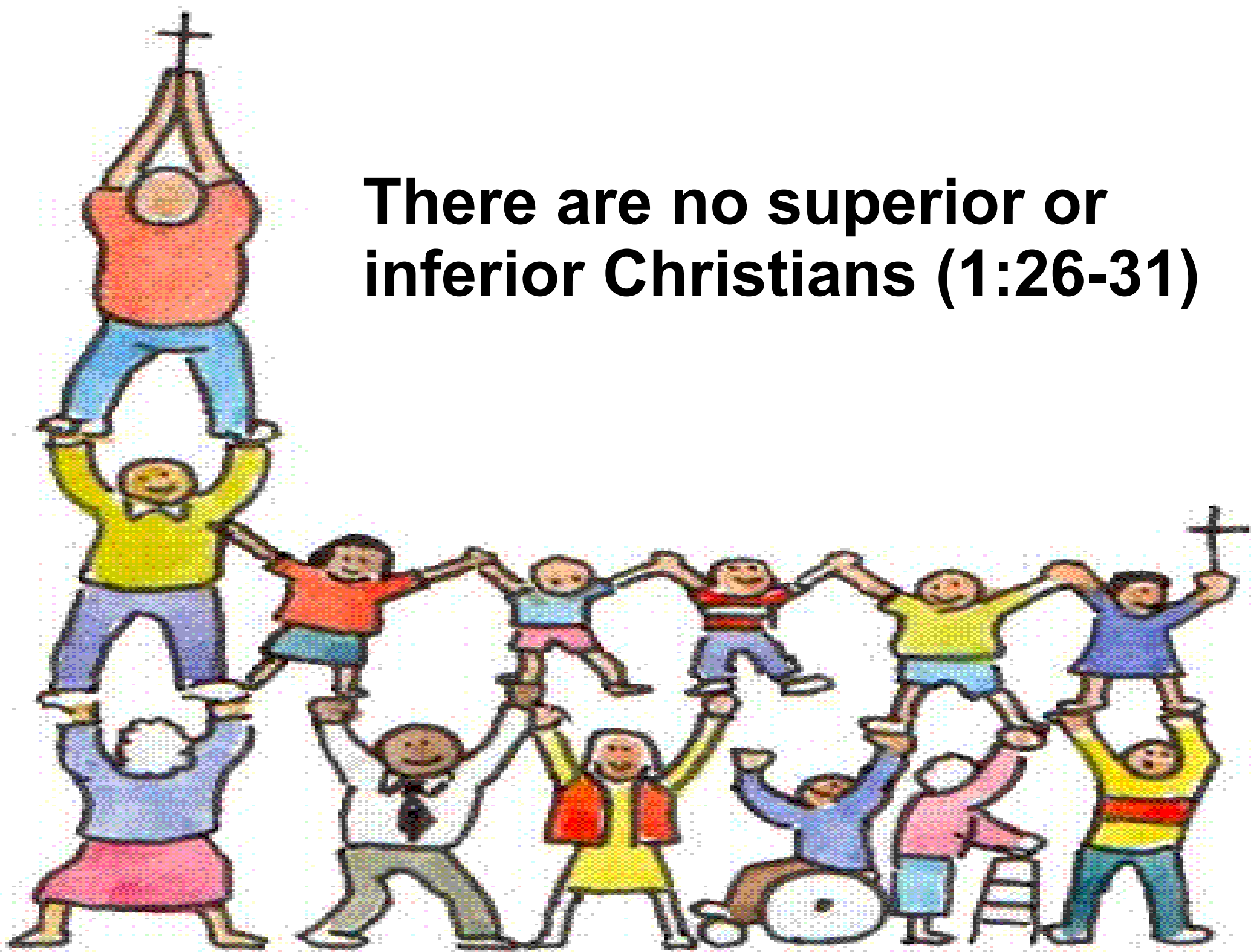
